Here is some practical information:

You are welcome from 3:00 PM. Check-out is at 10:00 AM.

You may arrive at any time. You can park your car next to the cottage; the door is open, and the key is on the table.

Please leave the key on the table upon check-out.

Please return the furniture to its original position.

Before departure, empty the fridge and do the dishes.

The cottage is located on our horse farm. You are welcome to approach the horses, but please do not feed them and do not open any gates or fences.

We also have three friendly chickens that you may feed your food scraps.

Food scraps that are not suitable for chickens can be placed in the compost bin next to the chicken run by the vegetable garden (including coffee filters and tea bags).

We recommend bringing comfortable shoes suitable for the countryside.

The cottage is equipped with a wood stove, electric heating in the bathroom, and a small but fully equipped kitchen (no oven or microwave).

Provided: pepper, salt, sugar, coffee, tea, oil, hand soap, dishwashing liquid, towels, bed linen, toilet paper, hand soap, and a hairdryer.

Please do not feed the cats or let them inside the cottage. All cats you encounter have a home.

I live right next to the cottage and have two watchful dogs. My garden is fenced, and the dogs always stay within the fence. Please do not enter my garden if the dogs are outside.
